DUAL ENROLLMENT AND A.P OPPORTUNITIES

- Students who qualify may take Dual Enrollment classes to earn college credit beginning in their Junior year.
- To qualify for the Dual Enrollment program a student must have an unweighted 3.0 GPA and a qualifying score in Reading, English and Math on either the CPT, PERT, ACT or the SAT.
- Students may take summer, evening or online Dual Enrollment courses.
- Students must maintain a 3.0 high school GPA while in the Dual Enrollment program. A student will become ineligible for the DE Program if their high school GPA drops below a 3.0.
- Any student making less than a C in English or Math will not receive college credit for that course and course will have to be repeated.
- Any Student who makes a D or F in a DE course must sit out one semester before being eligible to take DE courses again. Student must have approval from Guidance Counselor to resume taking DE courses.
- Any DE student whose college GPA falls below a 2.0 becomes ineligible for the DE program.
- **All students are eligible to take A.P courses and the A.P exam for classes that are offered at their grade level. Any student may take the A.P exam at the end of the year to earn college credit.**
- **A score of 3 or better is required on the A.P exam to receive college credit.**
